

# Early Childhood in Australia

An informative resource for educators looking to move from the UK to teach early childhood education in Australia.



In Australia, there are 3 levels of Early Childhood which are regulated by the <u>Australian Children's Education & Care Quality Authority</u>(ACECQA).

#### These include:

- Degree qualified educators
- Diploma qualified educators
- Certificate III (Cert III) level educators

All overseas trained Early Childhood (EC) educators require an ACECQA approved qualification to be eligible to work in Early Childhood in Australia. You can find a list of approved & formerly approved EC teaching, Diploma and Cert III level qualifications on the <u>ACECQA website</u>.

If your qualification has not been pre-approved, you will need to <u>apply to have your qualifications assessed</u> as an Australian equivalent. The cost is about \$130 and is a once-off expense.

### Requirements

### **ACECQA**

If you have studied overseas, to be eligible to work in Early Childhood in Australia you need to have your qualification assessed by <u>ACECQA</u>. ACECQA are the regulatory body for all things early childhood in Australia. They will assess your qualification and recognise it as an Australian equivalent, sending you a document to attest to this. The cost is about \$130 and is a once-off expense.

### CV and Referee Requirements

We will require your up-to-date CV with the contact details of at least 2 professional referees from Early Childhood settings (name, position, institute, professional email address, phone number). We will require at least one of your referees to be from a director or manager level. ### Victoria

### Early Childhood Teacher (ECT):

- ACECQA approved Early Childhood degree
- Early Childhood Teaching Registration with the Victorian Institute of Teaching (VIT)

### Diploma level & Cert III Educators:

- ACECQA approved qualifications
- Victorian Employee Working With Children Check

### Employee Working with Children Check (E-WWCC)

To work as a Diploma qualified of Cert III educator in Victoria (not kindergarten teacher/early childhood teacher) you will be required to apply for an E-WWCC which includes completing an online application and presenting your proof of identity at a local post office. As you will need to present your proof of ID, this means you will be unable to apply for your E-WWCC until you arrive in Melbourne. The application usually takes 2 weeks to process (worst case, 4 weeks) and costs \$126.50. E-WWCC Proof of ID Requirements:

#### First Aid Qualification

Most early childhood services require all educators to have up to date first aid, CPR, asthma and anaphylaxis certifications. These must have been completed in Australia. The recommended course is HLTAID004 Provide an emergency first aid response in an education and care setting. Having these qualifications mean you are eligible for work in all our early childhood settings. I have listed a couple of options for you below:

### **New South Wales**

#### **EC Teacher:**

- ACECQA approved Early Childhood Teacher level qualification
- NSW Working With Children Check
- Teaching accreditation with <u>NSW Educations & Standards Authority</u> (NESA)

### Diploma level & Cert III Educators:

- ACECQA approved qualifications
- NSW <u>Working With Children Check</u>

### Working with Children Check (WWCC)

To work in EC settings in Sydney, you will be required to apply for an <u>E-WWCC</u> which includes completing an online application and presenting your proof of identity at a <u>NSW service centre</u> or motor registry. As you will need to present your proof of ID, this means you will be unable to apply for your WWCC until you arrive in Sydney. Your NSW WWCC will cost \$80 and is valid for 5 years.

#### First Aid Qualification

Most early childhood services require all educators to have up to date first aid, CPR, asthma and anaphylaxis certifications. These must have been completed in Australia. The recommended course is HLTAID004 Provide an emergency first aid response in an education and care setting. Having these qualifications mean you are eligible for work in all our early childhood settings. We recommend the <u>Australian Training Institute</u>.

### Queensland

### EC Teacher: Birth -5 years of age:

- ACECQA approved Early Childhood Teacher level qualification
- QLD <u>Blue Card</u> (Working with Children Check)

### EC Teacher: birth - 8 years OR birth - 12 years of age:

- <u>ACECQA approved</u> Early Childhood Teacher level qualification
- Teaching registration with the **Queensland College of Teachers** (QCT)

### Diploma level & Cert III Educators:

- ACECQA approved Diploma or Cert III level qualifications
- QLD Blue Card

#### First Aid Qualification

The recommended course is HLTAID004 Provide an emergency first aid response in an education and care setting. Having these qualifications mean you are eligible for work in all our early childhood settings.
